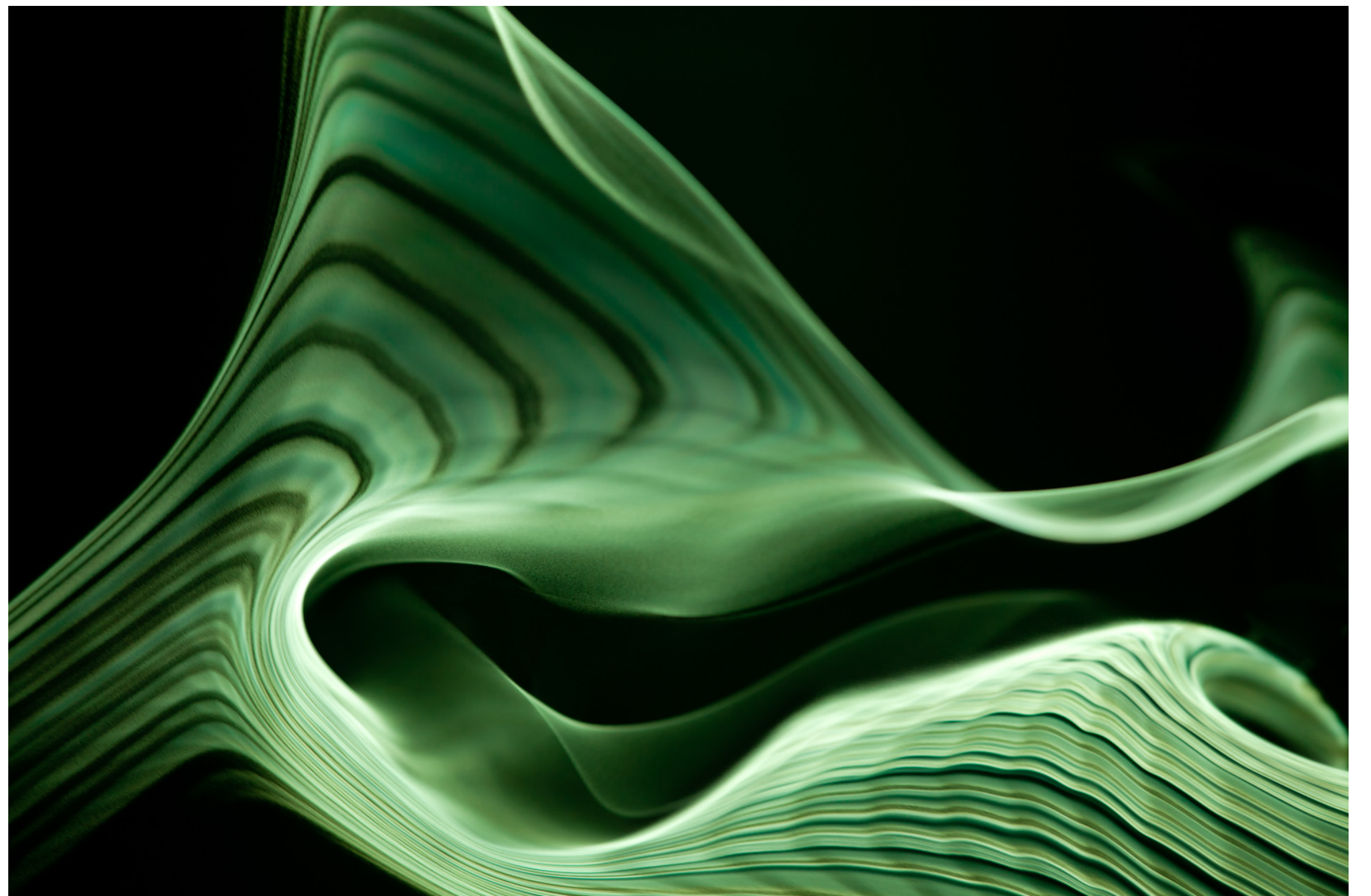

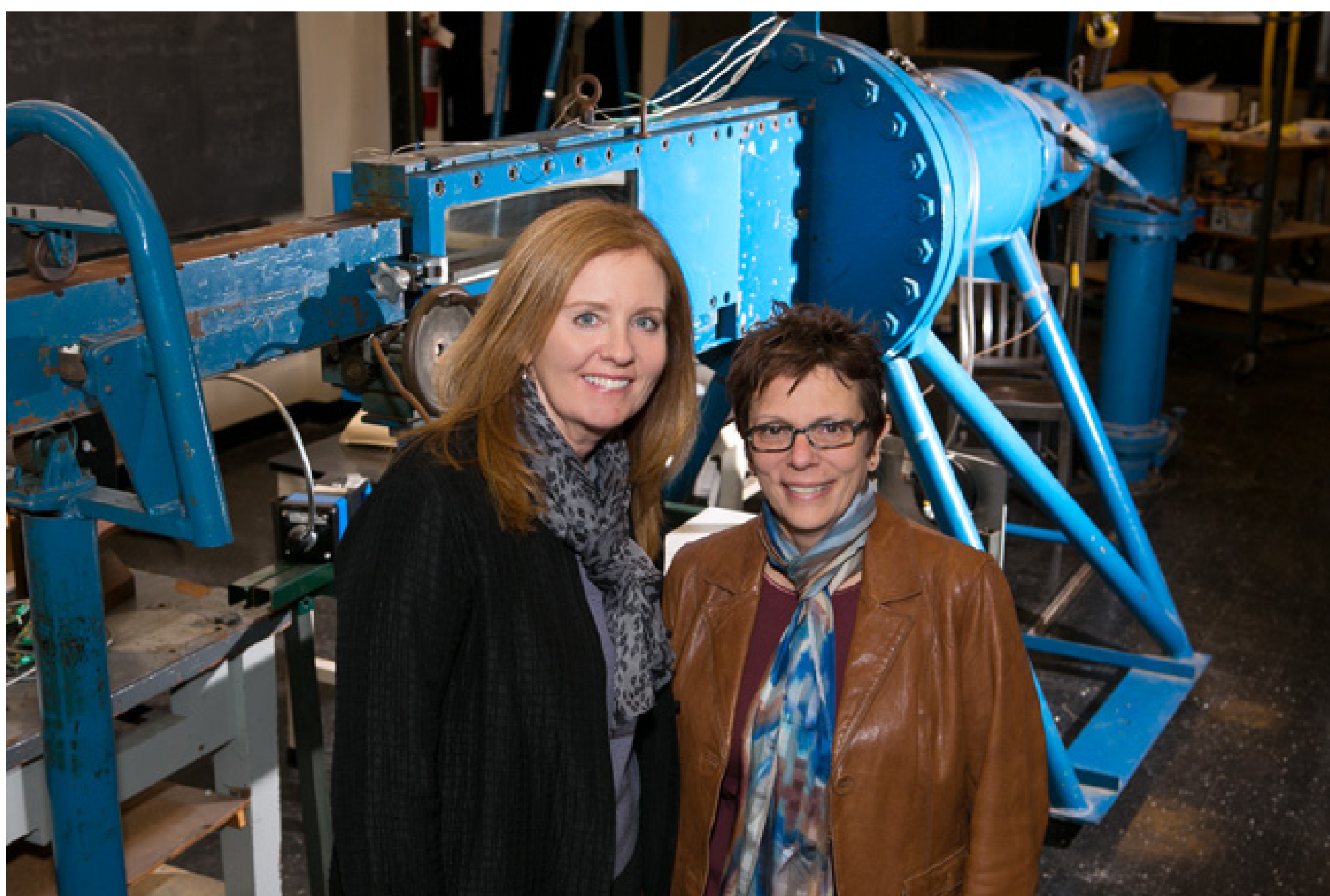
SHIRLEY NANNINI AND CANDACE WARK

737 North Michigan presents a new exhibition featuring six photographs by emerging Chicago artists Shirley Nannini and Candace Wark. The work showcases selections from their Viewing Silence series, which captures the essence of wind movement and conveys its transient nature. Smoke, introduced into a wind tunnel, flows over objects allowing visualization of the air flow in the wake. These unique images, captured at a moment in time, are abstract in appearance yet represent naturally occurring patterns.



The resulting photographs have been thrilling and inspiring to the artists and to many others. In Newcity Art, Michael Weinstein describes their work as “...a new generation of artists experimenting with novel approaches to wresting beguiling forms out of ordinary objects that leave everyday perceptions far behind.”
